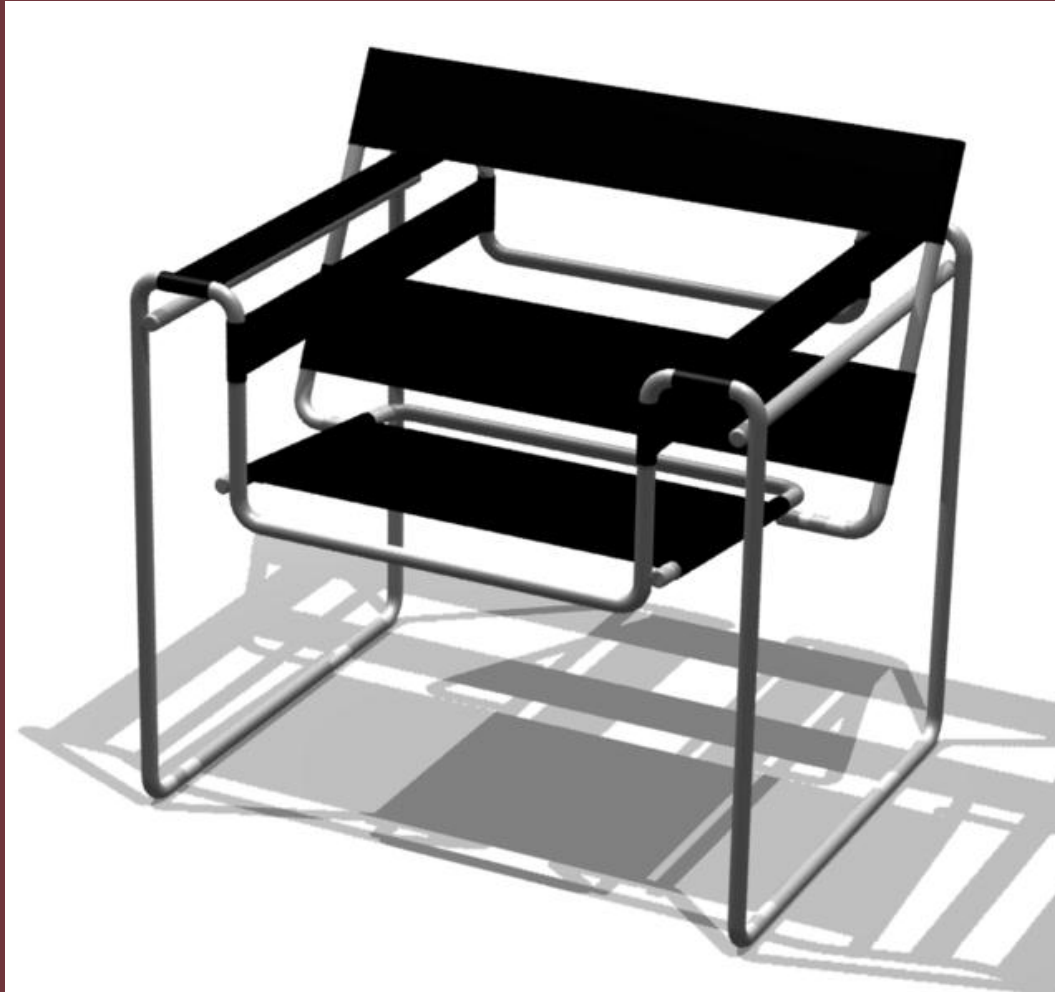

# Artistic Touch

- Since the Bauhaus school taught to combine art and technology in the best way possible, that's what we tried to do with our newly developed neighborhood.





# Rooftops

- Our simple, square design left us with flat tops. We fixed the problem of puddles and runoff by adding grass, which not only soaks up the water, it uses it to grow grass and a really cool look and creative style.







# Basement

- An addition of a 1/3 basement was important because it uses the space of the hill to its fullest, as well as creating more room in the home for a garage. This also adds to the artistic design, since the look of the house changes as you move from the front, to the back.





# Roads

- Most streets and roads pass in front of the home, but in our design they go behind the buildings, which gives a better feeling to the front of the house and walkway, while enabling the garage to be accessed easily.





# Skylights

- Skylights were obviously added to produce more light inside the home, without wasting electricity. Also, our design shows the windows as a part of the roof without protruding like most skylights do.





# Exterior

- These plaster walls are easily moldable and manageable at first, but once they harden and dry they are perfect for strong walls of a home. This material also adds an artistic flare, as if a giant pallet knife was used in the molding process.
